just 'best restored coach' – it has done even better. It is the overall winner of the HRA carriage and wagon contest as the best restoration of any rolling stock (coach, wagon, powered rolling stock).

this month at a ceremony in York. The trophy is an historic lamp (see illustration) which is on loan for two years. But we keep the associated plaque, which hopefully can be fitted to 2701. We are investigating where best to put the trophy on display.
