GRESLEY BUFFET 643

The Buffet has now completed its overhaul and is back in service in the Teak Train – though its newly restored pristine beauty rather emphasises the run-down condition of the rest of the set. This stems from the significant delay in the overhaul programme.

The lengthy time that 643 was out of service reflected some major repairs to remedy the stresses of its running environment and the delayed overhaul. SVR(H) operates some of the finest Gresley teak carriages in the country, and these irreplaceable treasures deserve the very best treatment to preserve them for future generations. The *Teak Train* is **not** 'just another coach set'.





PROGRESS WITH THE TOURIST THIRD OPENS (TTO)

43600 remains in Kidderminster C&W Works, stripped internally for extensive bodywork repairs prior to the interior improvements. Its new tables are about to be delivered, and the new lamps are in progress at Lost Wax Development Ltd, Kidderminster (the picture shows the first unpolished casting).

Meanwhile TTO 52255 has had a roof repair and its roof repainted.

PROGRESS WITH 70759







Work is advancing on creating the four compartments to meet the SVR's requirement for a revenue element in the project. These pictures illustrate the current position.

The left picture shows a trial fitting of a mirror (kindly donated by one of our supporters) along with pictures and lamps. This is to establish that the dimensions and locations will be correct in relation to the seating. The electrical wiring is being fitted as progress is made. The central picture shows the corridor screen, still some way from completion. And the third picture gives a general view of progress with the compartment walls and ceilings – the final section of compartment ceiling panel was fitted on 1st July. Again, the electrical wiring work is in evidence.

SPONSORSHIP - 70759 BOGIE OVERHAUL


Good and enthusiastic progress is being made on the bogie overhaul at Kidderminster.

Our Chairman, Hugh McQuade, has been out again with his shopping basket for replacement parts needed to put decent wheel sets under this vehicle. As with the recent successful appeal for the bogie bearing pads, we are hoping that 'someone out there' will be willing to sponsor these further essential, if unexciting, repair items. The shopping list this time comprises:

- Bogie Bolster Guide Plates. An order has been given to the Boro' Foundry for the four needed to deal with cracks in the existing plates. Each plate will cost £153+VAT (£183.60). So four will come to £734.40 ...
- Spring Hanger Bolts. Hopefully the bolts can be found from stock but they will need machining to finish. Machining costs £140 for one short type bolt and £120 each for four long bolts. That's £620 for the five. May we leave the thought with readers in the hope that these may also tempt some sponsorship?

LATEST TEAK PANEL POSITION



Forgive our repeating this diagram, now updated. Since the last newsletter appeal the panel sponsorship position has improved. Our thanks go to those involved. This means that all the panels on the corridor side and all the 'A' and 'D' panels are now fully sponsored.

Just two 'B' panels (£75 each) remain, along with three 'C' panels (each a modest £40) and five 'E' panels (£80/£90 each).

Another nudge will see this already incurred expenditure nicely covered.
